A FORMER CASTLE IN THE COUNTRYSIDE

Château de Bagnols The drawbridge and moat that surround this formidable stone building are far from the only reminders that it was once a 13th-century medieval castle. Inside Château de Bagnols, authentic tapestries and paintings adorn the public areas and 21 guestrooms and suites, each named in honor of a figure who helped shape the property's history. Located in the heart of the Beaujolais wine region, this historical monument opened its doors as a hotel-restaurant in 1992. With at least one staff member per guest, a majestic gourmet dining room, and impeccable attention to detail, Château de Bagnols is regarded as one of the world's finest vineyard chateau-hotels.
